

Hageman Ranch LLC Rules of Hunting

Hunting is a privilege -- not a right. Please follow these rules to protect your privilege to hunt on the ranch, and to protect its fragile hunting environment.

1. Lock the entrance gate behind you when you arrive, and when you leave.
2. Park in the designated parking area only. You will probably need a 4WD vehicle to get to the parking area. Sign in and out using the registry book located in the parking area.
3. Wear your trespass permission badge at all times while hunting on the ranch. Know with whom you are hunting and identify and report hunters who do not have a visible current trespass permission badge. You do not have the responsibility of confronting hunters that do not have a visible current badge, however, being able to locate them and point them out to law enforcement personnel will be helpful. Call George, who will deal with a trespassing situation, at 321-723-4320. Cell phone reception on the ranch is marginal, so seek higher ground with a longer view towards the east (i.e. towards Oak Creek) for the best reception.
4. Take your trash with you when you leave the ranch. There are no trash receptacles on the property.
5. Walk from parking area to hunting areas and associated hunting positions. Do not use 4WD vehicles to get from the parking area to your hunting area. Individuals who are mobility disabled can request consideration of a waiver of this rule. Call George at 321-723-4320 for a special pass.
6. Since movement of hunters promotes the tendency of game to leave the ranch for safer territory, refrain from moving from hunting positions. Sit, or use blinds, stands or other stationary hunting techniques to maximize your chance of bagging game and minimize the chance that you will chase the game off of the property. Due to liability concerns, the use of tree stands is not permitted.
7. Respect other hunters. If someone else stakes out a hunting area, then seek another. Hunting areas are chosen on a first come, first serve basis.
8. Use 4WD vehicles only to pick up downed game and transport it back to the parking area. Manually carry game from where it is downed to an existing road, as marked on the ranch map, before transporting it by vehicle to the parking area. Do not make any new roads or trails. When picking up game, please follow the most direct and non-obtrusive road to the game, load the game, and then return to the parking area. Use the same path if multiple trips are required.
9. Stay on the property. The Hageman Ranch LLC is not responsible for trespass charges if you inadvertently wander onto someone else's property. The map on the last page has all corner points marked in GPS locations (Datum=WGS84). If you do not have a GPS then ask someone who does or pay particular attention to the fences and make sure you know what side of each one you are on.
10. Do not hunt in the "Private Zone" indicated on the map. This is a private home whose residents value their privacy.
11. Do not make any open fires on the property.
12. There is no overnight camping allowed on the property.
13. All hunters are responsible for policing the property. If you see violations of the above rules, contact George at 321-723-4320 to report them.
